Angel L. Fernandez is General Manager, Oficina del Centro of the Madrid City Council, in addition to being Architectural Design Chair Professor at the School of Architecture, Universidad Europa, Madrid, Spain.

Fernandez has spent many years in public service, concurrently with his academic career. He has been Monuments Surveyor for the Ministry of Culture and for the Department of Education and Culture for the Regional Government of Castilla y León. He has been active on many commissions dedicated to culture, the arts, and history. Fernandez was awarded the Architectural Recovery Award by the Valladolid Royal Academy of Fine Arts for his work in recovering the Pasaje Gutiérrez.

Fernandez began his academic career as a professor of Art History at the School of Architecture, Universidad Politécnica, Madrid. He became a tenured professor in architectural design at the School of Architecture, Universidad de Valladolid, before assuming his present position at the Universidad Europa de Madrid. He was recognized for his contributions to architectural education with the Silver Medal of the Universidad Europa.

He is the author of a number of books on the subject of architecture and architectural preservation, and has participated in many symposia on these subjects. Fernandez is currently President of the Scientific Committee for the 10th International Congress on Architectural Heritage Preservation.

Fernandez earned his undergraduate degree and doctorate in architecture at the Universidad Politécnica.
